Reflections from your Rector (Interim)



Lent is upon us again, a time for reflection and a turning toward God. As I write this, it is just post-break in and while the church looks almost completely unscathed, we aren't. Someone violated our space and our hospitality, and someone did substantial damage to this communal building. I'll be honest with you, I never felt in danger, although I know our parish secretary Lynne Nuss did. However, I really was bowled over by the level of despair and hate inflicted on our

building. What do I as a follower of Jesus do or think or pray for in lieu of this? How do I pursue the way of love given the desecration I saw in this special and holy place? And I ask the same questions to you, how do you pray, how do you pursue the way of love in light of these events? For me, it's pretty clear and definitely not easy. After all's said and done, I have to pray for Seth Ketelhut, our intruder, for his mental and physical health; he was so very hurt in mind and in body (less seriously in body-quick visit to St. Francis took care of that). He needs God's healing grace as much as we do, if not more. The way of love is to grieve, grieve our loss of innocence, grieve our loss of a few items and our sense of safety, and to grieve for this absolutely broken man who would do such terrible things. I'm sorry if that makes you uncomfortable but if we believe what we say and what Jesus says, we pray especially for our enemies. And once we pray for an "enemy" he or she is no longer an enemy, but a creature of God, a human just like we are. Each one of you will deal with this event in your own way and God will be with you, tenderly holding you. For now, I can truthfully and emphatically say, I'm glad I'm here for you during this time and together we will stand stronger. The Lord be with all of us and also with Seth. Amen.
